Government Grants

Disabled Facilities Grant

Designed to support you in adapting your home to make it more accessible for a disabled person, a sensory room is considered eligible. This grant is only available to people living in England and Wales from your local authority and can cover up to 100% of the cost. For Scottish residents, the Independent Living policy allows for the adapatation of your home, however, this will need to be decided by your local authority For more information visit:
